### **SOCIAL DISTANCING WILL BE AROUND FOR AWHILE**

#### **--“Moving On With Our Lives” Will Still Include Preventative Measures Against Coronavirus**

That’s why, without an effective vaccine, social distancing will continue to be a recommendation for our new normal going forward.

This also means that large gatherings, where people are in close contact with one another for a long time will probably be slower to come back.

And we will still be encouraged to wear cloth face coverings to keep our secretions from getting on others.

These are pretty easy ways of preventing illness while there is uncertainty.

“We must continue to be vigilant about social distancing,” Governor Gordon said. “I am confident that the public and business community will continue to recognize that their actions will allow us to continue a safe, steady path forward.
